RE: Water Right Change Application No. CG2-21613 (THUR 08-01)

In accordance with RCW 90.80.080 the Department of Ecology (Ecology) has reviewed the Record of Decision (ROD) and Report of Examination (ROE), and all comments, protests, objections and other relevant information submitted by the Thurston County Water Conservancy Board (Board) for the above referenced application for change.

Ecology **REVERSES** the decision of the Board and the subject change is **DENIED** for the following reason:

In order for this change to be approved, certain associated voluntary relinquishments must occur in order for each of the landowner's water rights to stand alone and separate from the others. Otherwise, multiple water right change applications must be filed and processed to change the underlying associated water rights. The relinquishments described in the ROD fail to meet this standard. Because these relinquishments must be voluntary and originate from the landowners, Ecology cannot unilaterally modify this decision to achieve that end.

The Board failed to adequately analyze impairment of existing water rights, including but not limited to, instream flows on the Nisqually River and existing water rights from Thompson Creek.

The Board failed to adequately describe the impacts to surface water flows in the watershed, including but not limited to, stream flows in Thompson Creek and the Nisqually River.

The Board failed to adequately analyze the extent and validity of the subject water right. Ecology's records include a consultant report from 2005 that analyzed recent power records that indicate significantly less water available for change. This information



conflicts with the Board's extent and validity analysis, which must be reconciled prior to approval of the subject change.

The Board failed to analyze and quantify the extent of relinquishment of the water right including but not limited to, the stockwater portion of the right.

You have a right to appeal this decision. To appeal this you must:

- File your appeal with the Pollution Control Hearing Board within 30 days of the "date of receipt" of this document. Filing means actual receipt by the Board during regular office hours.
- Serve your appeal on the Department of Ecology within 30 days of the "date of receipt" of this document. Service may be accomplished by any of the procedures identified in WAC 371-08-305(10). "Date of receipt" is defined at RCW 43.21B.001(2).

Be sure to do the following:

- Include a copy of this document that you are appealing with your Notice of Appeal.
- Serve and file your appeal in paper form; electronic copies are not accepted.
